2023 Session

Legislative balance remains the same as before the 2022 election

Senate: 30 D to 19 R

• House: 57 D to 41 R

But individuals have changed

- 6 Senators did not run for reelection
- 20 Representatives did not run for reelection (7 ran for Senate or Congress)

Several important committees will make recommendations:


- Tax Structure Work Group

- Can use LWVUS or LWVWA positions



Revenue Forecast

Forecast drives budget

- Forecasts are produced in November,
 February, June and September
- Revenues for last biennium were higher than forecast
- The September 2022 forecast was
 - higher inflation;
 - lower personal income growth, housing construction, and construction employment;
 - lower expected revenue for next biennium
- November 2022 forecast slightly better but still below last biennium


Budget Issues

Budget drives Programs

Raising taxes is problematic

- WA has the most regressive tax structure in the US;
- Raising taxes is politically unpalatable;
- It also affects those at the lowest incomes the most

Issues – Tax Structure



WA State Budget & Policy Center reports that...

Racial Disparities

1 in 3 Black & Latinx families - can't pay rent/mortgage

1 in 6 non-white households with children do not have enough food

Latinx families with children are 3 times more likely to have no health insurance

1 in 10 non-white children do not have internet or digital device

Proposals to Change Tax Structure

Coalitions proposing greater change than Tax Structure Work Group

- 2019 Tax Structure Work Group Appointed
- 2021
 - Capital Gains tax
 - Working Families tax credit
- 2022
 - Report to Legislature due in December
- 2023 Likely tax change proposals:
 - Wealth tax
 - Replace B&O tax w/ margin tax
 - Local govt. property tax limit increase

Problems







- Housing shortage
- Income inequality
 - Homeless
 - Cost-burdened, at risk for homelessness
- Cost of housing
- Prevent loss of housing
- Create new housing
- Subsidize housing for lowest income people
- Provide supportive housing for those with long-term need
- Help people get ahead with education, training, reasonable wages

The Biggest Underlying Need is Affordable Housing

WA State housing shortage 225,000 units; population growth exacerbates this shortage

Legislative Proposals for Housing/ Homelessness



- Homelessness Prevention
 - Eviction prevention
 - Cash assistance
 - Housing & Essential Needs rental assistance.
 - Workforce stabilization
 - Tenant protections
 - Utility stabilization
 - Home ownership programs for people of color
- New Housing
 - Funding for Housing Trust Fund
 - Lower cost of housing through comprehensive planning

Issues: Health Care



Problems:

- Inadequate workforce for all needs
- Non-secular care providers with restrictions
- Protection of freedom of reproductive choice
- Long-term care funding

Issues: Health Care, cont'd



Anticipated legislative proposals:

- Additional protection of reproductive rights, legal protections and possibly a constitutional amendment proposal
- Assurance that health system acquisitions improve, rather than harm, access to affordable quality health care
- Increased access to death with dignity
- Move toward universal health care
- Hearing aid coverage requirement for private insurance
- Protection of the WA Cares Act

Issues: Behavioral Health Care




Problem: Lack services relative to need

Anticipated Legislative Proposals:

- Increase the behavioral health workforce.
- Increase access to behavioral health services in underserved areas and for underserved populations.
- Provide behavior health services in locations convenient and familiar to persons who might need those services, places such as schools and physicians' offices.
- Ensure access to behavioral health services at every level across the spectrum of services, from preventative care to inpatient hospitalization.

Issues: Transportation



Problems:

- Inadequate alternatives
 - To single-occupancy motor vehicles
 - For non-drivers, disabled, seniors, low-income
- Cost of infrastructure
- Greenhouse gas emissions

Anticipated Legislative Proposals:

- Transit-oriented development
- Increased funding for transit
- Examination of how railroads can be better utilized
- Alternative fuels
- New Airport

Issues: Climate Change



- Anticipated legislative proposals:
 - Reduce Greenhouse gas emissions in buildings
 - Solar energy
 - Salmon recovery strategies
 - Climate resiliency in local comp plans
 - Forest preservation

Issues: Criminal Justice

Problem: Racial & Economic Injustice

League Focus: Address paths to incarceration

Legislation Proposed:

- 45 bills pre-filed as of 1/2/23 out of 233 total
- Law Enforcement Training
- Incarceration Standards
- Holding w/out bail
- Sentencing
- Access to Counsel
- & Many more

Issue: Democracy

Proposals:

- Enhance voting rights act
- Abolish advisory ballots
- Updating voter registration processes
- Limiting Governor's rule-making power
- Documentation of citizenship on certain identification
- Rulemaking & open meetings




Issue: Education

Proposals:

- School safety
- Financial assistance to small districts
- Access to dual programs
- Equity in highly capable student programs
- Paraeducator employment standards
- Lower minimum age for compulsory education
