2024 Session

- Second half of Biennium; Short
 Session: 60 days (1/8/23 3/7/23)
- Bills remaining from 2023 session
 - If they still don't pass in 2024 and sponsor wants to still try, they are reintroduced in 2025 with a new number
 - A few new bills are introduced (527 as of 1/4/24)
- Supplemental budget (adjustments) will be adopted



Off to a Running Start



- Full week of committee hearings and executive sessions starting Monday
- Governor has produced supplemental budget request
- Leadership has announced their priorities

Session Context: Revenue Forecast

- Forecast drives budget
- Forecasts are produced in November, February, June and September
- Revenues for last biennium were higher than forecast
- The forecast for this year is positive



Dollars in millions




Budget Issues

- Budget drives programs
- Still not enough money to meet many needs
- Raising taxes is problematic, especially during a campaign year
 - WA has the most regressive tax structure in the US;
 - This affects those at the lowest incomes the most

Racial Disparities

WA State Budget & Policy Center reports that...

1 in 3 Black & Latinx families – can't pay rent/mortgage

1 in 6 non-white households with children do not have enough food

Latinx families with children are 3 times more likely to have no health insurance

1 in 10 non-white children do not have internet or digital device





Nearly 1 in 3 Black and Latins families with children have little or no confidence in their ability to pay their next rent or mortgage payment.

Approximately 1 in 6 Other and mixed race, Latins, and Black households with children sometimes or often did not have enough food to eat in the past two weeks.

Latins families with children are over 3x more likely to not have health insurance compared to the state average overall (28% compared to 9%). **1**in10

About 1 in 10 children in Other or mixed race households enrolled in grades K-12 did not have internet and a computer or digital device usually or always available for educational purposes.

Issues to Watch: Proposals to Change Tax Structure

- 2019 Tax Structure Work Group Appointed
- 2021
 - Capital Gains tax
 - Working Families tax credit
- 2022
 - Report to Legislature due in December
- 2023 Tax change proposals Still on the table
 - Wealth tax, Estate Tax
 - Replace B&O tax w/ margin tax
 - Local govt. property tax limit increase





Issues to Watch: <u>Housing/Homelessness</u>

- Problems
 - Housing shortage
 - Income inequality
 - Homeless
 - Cost-burdened, at risk for homelessness
 - Cost of housing
 - Just five states (California, New York, Florida, Washington, and Texas) account for 55 % of unhoused people.
- Solutions
 - Prevent loss of housing
 - Create new housing
 - Subsidize housing for lowest income people
 - Provide supportive housing for those with long-term need
 - Help people get ahead with education, training, reasonable wages

Homeless or Unstably Housed, All Ages






Homeless or Unstably Housed Adults, 18 to 64

2024 Legislative Proposals for Housing/ Homelessness

- Rent Stabilization
- Allow new kinds of housing (e.g., co-living)
- Other tenant protections, especially mobile/ manufactured housing residents
- Permanent funding with progressive revenue to build affordable homes at the scale the crisis requires.





Issues to Watch: Health Care

- Inadequate workforce for all needs
- Non-secular care providers with restrictions
- Protection of freedom of reproductive choice
- Long-term care funding
- Many behavioral health needs



2024 Health Care Legislation

- SB 5241 Concerning material changes to the structure of participants in the healthcare marketplace (previously Keep Our Care Act (KOCA)). Would limit/ condition mergers and acquisitions of hospitals and healthcare facilities.
- SJM 8006 Requesting that the Federal Government create a Universal Health Care Program.
- SJR 8202 Senate Joint Resolution. Amending the State Constitution to address reproductive freedom.

Issues to Watch: Behavioral Health Care

- **Problem**: Lack services relative to need
- Anticipated Legislative Proposals:
 - Increase the behavioral health workforce.
 - Increase access to behavioral health services in underserved areas and for underserved populations.
 - Provide behavior health services in locations convenient and familiar to persons who might need those services, places such as schools and physicians' offices.
 - Ensure access to behavioral health services at every level across the spectrum of services, from preventative care to inpatient hospitalization.

Issues to Watch: Transportation

• Problems:

- Inadequate alternatives
 - To single-occupancy motor vehicles
 - For non-drivers, disabled, seniors, low-income
- Cost of infrastructure
- Greenhouse gas emissions
- Ferry System Problems


• Anticipated Legislative Proposals:

- Transit-oriented development
- Increased funding for transit
- Examination of how railroads can be better utilized
- Alternative fuels
- New Airport




Climate Change & Transportation

Issues to Watch: Climate Change

Anticipated legislative proposals:

- Green (no emission) School Buses
- Continued work on salmon recovery strategies
- Old-growth Forest preservation

Issues to Watch: Criminal Justice

- SB 5624 Implementing Recommendations of the **Substance Use Recovery** Services Advisory Committee (SURSAC) to recognize that substance use disorders should be treated as a a public health issue, not a criminal justice issue.
- HB 1087 Ending Long-Term Solitary Confinement, prohibiting solitary confinement except for emergencies, medical isolation, or when requested by the person who is incarcerated.
- HB 1586 Vehicle Pursuit Study Group, authorizing the Criminal Justice Training Commission to create a work group to study vehicle pursuits and come up with policy recommendations.
- HB 1513 Improving Traffic Safety, preventing law enforcement officers from pulling people over for violations that don't impact safety, limit searches following traffic stops, and provide funding to help people fix violations.
- HB 1579 Independent Prosecutions for Police Use of Force, setting up an Independent Prosecutions Unit in the Attorney General's Office to prosecute crimes involving the use of deadly force by police officers.
- HB 1479 Restricting Use of Restraint and Isolation of Students in Public Schools, banning use of isolation and mechanical and chemical restraints except when school resource officers are making arrests.
- HB 1445 Attorney General Investigations and Reform, giving the AGO to investigate law enforcement and local corrections agencies that have engaged in systemic violations of the WA State Constitution or state laws.



Issues to Watch: Democracy

- HB 1241 Protecting Elections and Election Workers, increasing penalty for harassment of an election official
- HB 1885/SB 5832 Prohibiting Campaign Contributions and Expenditures by Foreign-Influenced Corporations, foreign-influenced corporate spending in elections, protect the basic principle of democratic selfgovernment, and improve trust in our elections.
- HB 1882 Giving cities and towns the freedom to switch their general elections to evennumbered years.
